I am a full-time Acute Physician and lecture at Bangor University.

I published the first peer-reviewed paper on Early Warning Scores and my research since focuses on collaborative working to create pragmatic solutions for practicing clinicians (<http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/?term=subbe>).

With other members of SAM research I have grown the Society for Acute Medicine's Benchmarking Audit (SAMBA) into a national brand that is now consulted by the RCP, DoH and NICE. SAMBA16 collected data from over 100 units and 4500 patients. SAMBA has given hundreds of collaborators a first taste of Acute Medicine research.

I am co-founder of safer@home, the 1st international research collaboration in Acute Medicine and the Crisis Checklist Collaborative as an international patient safety group.

Both groups bring together junior and senior researchers for relaxed Friday/Saturday workshops to network, develop ideas and grant applications. This is something that I believe is needed to take SAM research to the next level.
