



Is this acute headache a migraine?



Is it **PULSATILE** ?

Was **ONSET** <72 hrs ago ?

Is it **UNILATERAL** ?

Is it **NAUSEATING** ?

Is it **DISABLING** ?

If 4 out of the 5 **POUND** criteria are met, there's a >90% likelihood that this is a migraine.

Will a CGRP receptor antagonist help?

Rimegapant and **Atogepant** are both CGRP receptor antagonists that have been found to be effective in treating and/or preventing migraines.

Rimegapant and **Atogepant** can be used to **TREAT** migraines if, previously:

- at least 2 triptans were tried and did not work well enough **OR**
- triptans were contra-indicated or not tolerated **AND** simple analgesia didn't work

Rimegapant can be used to **PREVENT** migraines in patients who:

- have 4 – 15 migraine attacks per month **AND**
- have tried or not tolerated at least 3 preventative medications
