



# (Focused Acute Medical Ultrasound course)

## Course Overview

The FAMUS course is the recognized point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS) standard for Acute Medicine physicians, designed to enhance the management of acutely unwell adult patients. Endorsed by the Society for Acute Medicine and recognized by the AIM training committee, this course provides a structured pathway for achieving AIM POCUS competencies

## Learning Outcomes

- Identify key anatomical structures in thoracic, abdominal, and vascular ultrasound images.
- Perform ultrasound techniques in real clinical scenarios
- Distinguish normal from pathological findings
- Recognise the limitation of POCUS that necessitates further imaging or expert input
- Integrate ultrasound findings with clinical information to make clinical decisions
- Contribute to training or supervision of junior colleagues in basic POCUS techniques
