Don't just think FAST... BE-FAST

Balance, Eyes, Face, Arms, Speech, Time (BE-FAST)
More sensitive at detecting acute stroke but less specific

BE-FAST sensitivity 91% and specificity 53%

FAST sensitivity 76% and specificity 68%

20% of STROKES ARE POSTERIOR AND WE MISS 30-35%

Thrombolysis Ischaemic Stroke - now up to 9 hours

Thrombectomy for Large Vessel Occlusion – up to 12 hours (or more...)

-CT perfusion imaging and new national stroke guidelines now enable more patients to be considered for reperfusion therapy.

Don't forget DVLA guidance

- -Can't drive for 4 weeks after TIA or minor, non disabling stroke. Don't need to notify DVLA but should inform insurance company
- -If disabling stroke, do need to notify DVLA
- -If HGV driver, not to drive for a year and notify DVLA
- -Check up to date DVLA guidelines regularly as these change

Clopidogrel

- -It is a prodrug, metabolised by CYP2C19 to its active form.
- -Omeprazole (often co-prescribed) but reduces efficacy, switch to alternative e.g. lansoprazole
- -Recent evidence shows up to a 30% of the UK population cannot metabolise clopidogrel effectively
- -Patients with recurrent TIA or stroke despite being on clopidogrel? -Consider resistance
- -NICE currently recommends CYP2C19 genotype testing
